Facilitate conversations to help others live the life Jesus died and rose for them to live. Create a safe place, encourage authenticity, celebrate breakthroughs, and lead the way!

SERMON QUESTIONS:

We are challenging every group to read through Ephesians as we go through this series. Before starting, pray for God to speak to you through this weeks message.

SCRIPTURE: Ephesians 1:1-14 (NIV).

DISCUSS: God has given us “every spiritual blessing in Christ.”

Q1 — Do you ever feel unequipped for the call on your life? Explain.

DISCUSS: “You can’t put away scripture that makes you uncomfortable, **you must press into it.**”

Q2 — What is your response to feeling uncomfortable with the Bible? How can we dive deeper into scripture together?

DISCUSS: Often times in the church, people can become bullies with their theological doctrine over others.

“When **right** doctrine makes you mean, it’s makes your doctrine **wrong.**”

Q3 — How can you love people more than your beliefs? Where have you fallen short here before?

DISCUSS: When writing Ephesians, Paul wasn’t thinking about a debate. His hope was to humble a church that was on the edge of major division.

Q4 — How can we bring **unity** into the church instead of more division?

DISCUSS: “The only way to disarm pride is to bring **humility.**”

Q5 — How could humility impact areas of pride in your life?

DISCUSS: “Humility isn’t a character trait you can work on, it’s a byproduct of being in the presence of God.”

Q6 — How has being in the presence of God brought **humility** into your life?

Q7 — What step do you need to take this week to ensure time with Jesus?

Q8 — Knowing that God initiated love on your behalf, how has that brought **peace** into your life?

Q9 — How has glorious grace given you **confidence, assurance, and inheritance** specifically in your life?
