## SERMON QUESTIONS:

We are challenging every group to read through Ephesians as we go through this series. Before starting, pray for God to speak to you through this weeks message.

**SCRIPTURE: Ephesians 2:11-22 (NIV).**

**DISCUSS:** “Relational unity begins with Gospel humility.”

Q1 — How does our new identity in Christ and citizenship in Heaven heal division in our world?

**DISCUSS:** Verse 14 and the “wall of hostility.”

Q2 — What stood out to you about how Jesus destroyed the "wall of hostility"? In your context, where are there "walls of hostility" that need to be destroyed?

**DISCUSS:** “Church is called to be an alternative to culture, not a reflection of it.”

Q3 — As a citizen of Heaven, what does it look like to be an alternative to culture?

Q4 — What parts of culture do you fear you most reflect?

**DISCUSS:** “As soon as you become a citizen of Heaven, you become a foreigner in this world.” Read **Philippians 3:20** as a group.

Q5 — What does it mean FOR YOU to be a citizen of Heaven? What does this look like practically in your life?

**DISCUSS:** “Unity is the method God is using to bring light to a lost, dark, and broken world.”

Q6 — Why do you think unity is the way Jesus is made known? What is so countercultural about unity in Christ?

Q7 — Going into this election, is there anything that you feel convicted about in relation to how you have viewed politics?

Q8 — How can you be more focused on the fame and renown of Jesus through this season?
